## Article VII, Sections 1 and 1B

1 2	WHEREAS,	2015 unification of the prior Wisconsin Councils merged members, staff, and resources; and			
3 4	WHEREAS,	current structure was designed to attempt equal representation throughout our State; and			
5 6 7 8	WHEREAS,	membership has decreased disproportionately across each old jurisdiction of our currently defined structure, leaving higher member density populations with less representation and leaving lesser member density populations with more representation; and			
9 10	WHEREAS,	the old "labels" of structure within jurisdictions bring ongoing negative connotations in trying to reach true reunification goals of ONE Wisconsin AFSCME; and			
11 12	WHEREAS,	decreased membership no longer sustains an executive board as large as the current structure dictates; and			
13	WHEREAS,	prudent use of financial resources requires change at this time.			
14 15 16 17	THEREFOR	<b>E, BE IT RESOLVED,</b> that the delegates to this Annual Convention of AFSCME Council 32 assembled via Telephone Town Hall Meeting on May 16, 2020, hereby authorize deleting the current language under Article VII, Section 1B and amending it to read as follows:			
18 19		"B. Executive board members shall be elected on a district and sector basis as set forth below.

Each district shall elect at least one (1) executive board member. Additional representation shall be determined on a per capita basis for the twelve months used for determining voting strength at the convention. Each district's membership in excess of 1,000 shall elect one (1) additional executive board member. Each district's membership in excess of 2,000 shall elect two (2) additional executive board members. For every additional 1,000 in membership above 2,000, a district shall elect one (1) additional executive board member.			
29 30 31 32 33		A candidate for district executive board member must be employed within the district and jurisdiction in which they seek office. Only delegates representing members employed in a jurisdiction within a district shall be eligible to nominate or vote for candidates for executive board members from such district.

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delegates authorize amending Article VII, Section 1, to
   read:
- "The executive board of this council shall consist of four (4) officers, twenty one (21)
  executive board members four or more (4+) district executive board members, sector
  executive board members (number to be determined by per capita), a retiree
  representative, and the executive director. At each convention at which elections are
  held, the delegates shall first elect officers and thereafter elect executive board
  members. The term of office for all elected members of the executive board shall be
  two years."
